

# Proclamation

*By Mayor and Council - Township of North Brunswick*

**WHEREAS**, the Township of North Brunswick's **Veteran Street Sign Program** allows Township residents who were Wartime Veterans to be recognized by adding their name on a secondary street sign to an existing Municipal Road; and

**WHEREAS**, by adding names of local Wartime Veterans to public street signs, we hope to promote public awareness of these individuals and show our appreciation for their outstanding contributions and service to our country as a member of the United States Armed Forces; and

**WHEREAS**, eligible military candidates for this honor include honorably discharged Veterans having served in Military Departments as defined under Department of Defense which include Departments of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and the Coast Guard; and

**WHEREAS**, Wartime Veterans are individuals who served in the active military forces, during a period of armed conflict or who received the armed forces expeditionary or other campaign service medals during an emergency condition, including those who died in the line of duty in the active military forces; and

**WHEREAS**, **Adrian Ailey** has been selected to be recognized in the Veteran Street Sign Program; and

**WHEREAS**, **Adrian** was born on June 5, 1985 in the Bronx, New York to Morris and Lorna Ailey; and

**WHEREAS**, **Adrian** enlisted in the United States Army from September 2004 to January 2009. During his time of service he was deployed for fifteen months to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. His mission was to guarantee the welfare and overall security for thousands of troops and civilian personnel on the base Quick Reaction Force for Camp Speicher. Adrian would also coordinated non-mission related activities to raise morale and reduce stress for his fellow combat personnel. He was awarded several medals which included the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal with Campaign Star, the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the Army Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Non-Commissioned Officer Professional Ribbon, the Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service (2 awards), Drivers and Mechanic Badge, and the Rifle Sharpshooter Qualification Badge. He was Honorably Discharge from the United States Army in January 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, **Adrian** graduated from Ramapo College of New Jersey after returning from service in the United States Army. He earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Science with a Concentration in Community Health. He worked as a Probation Officer with the New Jersey Judiciary in Middlesex Family Court from September 2014 to August 2017. He currently continues his service for his country and community at the North Brunswick Township Police Department as a Patrol Officer; and

**WHEREAS**, **Adrian** was married to Rebecca Lynn in 2017 and they reside in North Brunswick Township.

**NOW, THEREFORE, WE**, the Mayor and Council of the Township of North Brunswick, **DO HEREBY PROCLAIM**, distinguished recognition to **Adrian Ailey** for his service to our country ensuring freedom for all.
